

## Northgate attends Earth Summit Virtual Launch!

Towards the end of May a small group of Northgate and Dereham 6<sup>th</sup> Form students attended a virtual launch for the 'Take Action' Earth Summit which is due to take place in Lund, Sweden, in October. Seven schools from the UK, Sweden and the USA joined forces for the



launch of this exciting project. There were two guest speakers from the USA and London. One spoke about a youth climate programme they run within their community whilst the other gave an insight into their work with Greenpeace. Both gave valuable advice to students for their work ahead. The aim is for each school to plan projects with an eco-theme to put into action within their school or local community, to learn about what others are doing and look at the progress made over the coming months. It will culminate in all the students meeting in Lund in the Autumn. Our students said they felt inspired, motivated and enthusiastic about the project and along with schemes that are already in place, set up by the School Council and Environment Team, they have a few more plans in the pipe line. ## Learning Hub and Accelerated Reader Updates

A reminder that the Learning Hub is open for students to use during break time, lunch time and after school (homework club) on the days mentioned on the right. Students can make use of the computers and borrow some of the many books available. Students who take part in accelerated reader can exchange their books on their particular day as well as during some lessons.

When we returned to school in March we re-launched the Accelerated Reader programme with Year 7 and Year 8.

#### HOMEWORK CLUB

The Learning Hub will be open everyday after school until 4.30pm for students to drop in, complete homework and use the resources available

Due to Covid regulations, students will only be able to attend on the selected day specified below: MONDAY - YEAR 7 TUESDAY - YEAR 8 WEDNESDAY - YEAR 9 THURSDAY - YEAR 10 FRIDAY - YEAR 11



The programme is designed to improve pupils' reading ability, raise their reading age and encourage and nurture a love of reading. Year 7 and 8 students read within one lesson a day, as research shows clearly that a pupil who reads regularly for 20 minutes per day is far more likely to be successful at GCSE level and beyond.

Accelerated Reader has had a positive impact on our students over the last few years, and we have seen some incredible improvements in their reading. In the last couple of years many of our students who have taken part in the programme have improved their reading age by at least a year, and some have improved by as much as three and a half years.

Since returning from lockdown a staggering **3,684,435** words have been read. Our top classes are currently 7Aspire and 8Tenacity. Top Readers (based on words read and guizzes completed) are Daniel A, Bella B and Sudenaz A in Year 7 and Blake B, Thomas G, Dominic T and Chloe G-N in Year 8 – well done to all of you!
