Northgate shortlisted for National Award



Miss Theobald was excited to receive an email in the middle of November explaining that Northgate had been nominated and then shortlisted, along with 4 other schools from across the country, for the Environmental Practice Award at the Education Business Awards 2020! This award is given to a school project that can demonstrate a benefit to the environment and the environmental education of its pupils. This shortlisting came completely out of the blue and is something we are incredibly proud of as a school. We have worked hard over the last couple of years on our plastic campaigns, including 'bottle free Friday', two Terracycle recycling schemes and our 'war on plastics'. 2020 has been a very successful year so far, being awarded Eco Champion status by Streetspace UK in February, and winning the Norwich and Norfolk Eco Award in March, after receiving highly commended in 2019.

Members of the Environment Team and School Council joined Miss Theobald for the socially distanced virtual awards ceremony which was streamed live. It was great to have them back together and for their hard work to be recognised. Unfortunately we were not named as the winners, however we are determined as a school to continue our efforts related to environmental issues, and ensure all our students and staff are aware of the positive impact they can have, however small this might be.

Northgate Remembers

To commemorate Armistice Day, Northgate High School and Dereham Sixth Form held a short remembrance service. The poignant event was attended by just a limited number of staff and students in compliance with Covid guidance and restrictions. Mr MacDonald, who coordinated the service said, 'Remembrance in school was a challenge this year, as we wanted to ensure the safety of everyone involved, while allowing students and staff the opportunity to pause for reflection and remember "our fallen". It is an honour to conduct this event every year and I am proud of our students who represented their year group bubbles with pride'.

The service included the poem 'In Flanders Fields' read by Head Boy and Head Girl, Jimmy and Maisie, and Year 9 student, Dexter, played the 'Last Post'. A student representing each year group, from Year 7 to 13, placed their crosses and poppies onto our Garden of Remembrance, followed by the Heads of School who laid a cross and wreath, in memory of our fallen.

Northgate takes part in Make Your Mark Campaign



During November all students from Year 7 to 13 had the opportunity to vote in the UK Youth Parliament 'Make Your Mark' campaign.

The issues students vote as the most important will be debated by Members of Youth Parliament. They will campaign to influence the UK Parliament and their local representatives, ensuring that the views of young people are listened to by decision makers. This was an opportunity to influence decision makers who can make a real difference on the issues that matter to our young people. Make Your Mark is one of the most important and influential ways young people can take part in a democratic process.

The issues in this year's campaign included: supporting our mental health, free university places, tackling child poverty, stopping plastic pollution, increasing racial awareness in the curriculum, taking action on the climate emergency and votes at 16. Other topics included tackling discrimination and hate crime in the UK, including young people in the plan for Covid-19 recovery and protecting human rights.

Students could also vote for one of the following issues more locally: access to training and jobs, young people's voices should be heard in creating local services, leisure and culture facilities, ending the health postcode lottery, improving places to go and things to do for young people, access to technology and broadband for learning, childhood obesity and food poverty, homelessness, domestic violence and improving transport facilities.

We look forward to seeing which issues are picked by thousands of students who have taken part across the country.
