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Recycling Updates

It's been a while since we've updated you on our recycling schemes and we have a new recycling scheme to tell you about.

A big thank you to everyone in the community who is currently supporting our writing instrument, crisp packet and bread bag schemes and in particular to Morrisons and Nationwide Building Society who have collection boxes in the store/branch for their customers.

We have now collected 185Kg of writing instruments, 265Kg of crisp packets and 2.4Kg of bread bags and bakery plastic. Students can bring these items into school and either put in the boxes in the main hall (crisp packets and bread bags), or pen pots in classrooms or hand over to Miss Theobald.

Our new recycling scheme is in partnership with Think-Inks. The aim is to recycle as many ink cartridges and printheads as possible. Some of these hold value and so our Northgate School Council and Dereham Sixth Form Senate will then be able to put money towards future projects. You can find out more information in our letter here - please help us not only to prevent this plastic going to landfill but also to raise valuable funds.

Finally, we are really looking forward to our plastic recycling machine arriving, courtesy of a £10,000 grant from Breckland Council. Students can start bringing in washed and clean plastic mentioned on our poster and put in the black recycling bins near TE7. A group of



students will then work
alongside Mr Mottley and
use the machine to grind the
plastic into pellets and then
melt into new plastic sheets.
These will be used in Design
Technology projects and
hopefully on further eco
initiatives.



Northgate Remembers

We were proud to be able to hold our annual Service of Remembrance at Northgate on Thursday 11th November. Representatives from Northgate and Dereham Sixth Form took part in the service which included readings, the Last Post, a moving piano interlude and the laying of crosses, poppy pebbles and a wreath. 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Erasmus - Humans First Project

A group of Year 7 - 10 students recently spent the week working alongside Miss Brooks on a project which involved virtual meetings with schools in Germany, Italy and Spain. The theme of the project was sustainability and in particular renewable energy. As well as finding out about renewable energy in the regions close to the four schools, students conducted experiments to see which renewable energy sources would be better in those locations. They attended a virtual talk by an atmospheric scientist and a workshop on how to write a persuasive piece



on climate change.
