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#### Northgate's Eco Drive

We are so proud of our students and their passion for the environment. Our recent initiative 'Bottle Free Friday' is one example of this. By not selling any bottle drinks, cans or cartons each Friday we are reducing the number of single use bottles sold each year at Northgate by approximately 8700.



Many of these bottles would ultimately have been thrown away. Students are having to think more about their environmental impact and we hope this perhaps makes them question other aspects and how they can do their bit. Northgate's pen recycling scheme and crisp packet recycling scheme continue. We have been amazed by the response of the community including local primary schools and businesses who have helped us recycle over 116Kg of writing instruments and over

108Kg of crisp packets. This has helped us to raise over £260 for Cancer Research UK and prevented this plastic from going to landfill. As we speak, we are currently waiting to find out if Northgate's 'War on plastic' application has been shortlisted for the Norwich and Norfolk Eco Awards.

### Year 7 Goals and Aspirations

Back in November our Year 7 pupils attended a special assembly which launched the new academic coaching programme. John Baumber, from the Kunskapsskolan schools (KED) in Sweden, who we have collaborated with on this project, spoke to pupils about taking steps to achieve their goals and what this programme can do for them. Each Year 7 was assigned a 6th Form coach as well as their tutor, who met with them to discuss various educational milestones and begin to target areas for improvement and aim to develop a career pathway.

Tasks were completed in order to build a portfolio of evidence of what they want to achieve, how they are going to achieve it, when they think they can achieve it and why they want to achieve it. In January, Year 7 pupils presented their 'Ultimate Goal' to tutors and parents. We were very pleased to see so many parents attending these special presentations. Following the presentations, the coaching will look at the day to day short term gains pupils can do to move along the pathway they have set out for themselves.

Mr Llewellyn, Year 7 tutor, said, 'The presentations were a wonderful opportunity to see how pupils see themselves in the future and share it with their parents. Career choices ranging from vets to football players, and from teachers to policemen, showed us the level of ambition our pupils

have. I was particularly impressed with the time and effort some put into their presentation including one pupil who created a short animation to accompany his words.

Well done to all in Year 7 for their fantastic work!
