Recycling Updates

The School Council's recycling endeavours continue
and although the School Council are currently not able to meet, they are still keen to
promote the recycling schemes we have at Northgate. Every classroom has a pot in for
used writing instruments. This Terracycle scheme started at Northgate back in
October 2018 and since then, with the help of some of our feeder schools, we have sent
away over 132Kg of pens, felt tips and markers that otherwise would have gone to
landfill. Students are encouraged to put their used pens from home or school in the
classroom pots and think about the positive impact they can have.

The second scheme, recycling crisp packets, was launch in April 2019 and in that time over 157Kg of crisp packets have been sent away to be recycled. Northgate has been supported by the local community, schools and businesses in this scheme. Through recycling these items, we have also raised over £400 for the School Council's chosen charity, Cancer Research UK. Whilst most students are unable to access the crisp collection boxes in the main hall at the moment, there are some boxes in classrooms where crisp packets can be deposited or they can be dropped off with Miss Theobald.

Again, we would encourage students, staff and families to do what they can to help our efforts – it's something very easy we can all contribute to. Thank you to everyone who has supported the schemes so far.

At Northgate we understand the importance of excellent attendance and the impact it can have on progress and attainment. We are looking forward to starting up our fortnightly attendance competition between the tutor groups again and celebrating great attendance on social media.

Updates from the ELF

The ELF (External Learning Facility) is now in its 6th year. Home to a whole range of animals including pigs, a goat, chickens, ducks, rabbits, a guinea pig and love birds, it offers a unique outdoor learning experience for Northgate students. There's also seating at the amphitheatre, a stage for performances, vegetable patches and an Anderson shelter.

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Mr MacDonald, gives us an update on life in the ELF since lockdown. 'This has been a challenging period in the ELF throughout lockdown and the return to school. The summer and recent weather has doubled the time I spend in the ELF. This does not phase me though as I understand the routine and needs of the animals in the ELF. The water is transported daily in a range of containers. Snuffle & Truffle our Kune Kune pigs snort their way through many litres of fresh water, it's important to keep them hydrated. I have recently made use of the old artificial grass, recycling it and putting it in the ELF. Ben our Pygmy goat loves jumping all over it and teasing Snuffle & Truffle from the other side of his paddock woodland area. There has been an increase in wildlife in the ELF during lockdown, I rescued a deer, spotted a family of new hatchling pheasants and our regular oyster catcher took up residence in the ELF with three chicks.

I have also entered the Solana schools potato growing competition, which we have previously won, and our entry was collected during lockdown.

It is clear the way we conduct ourselves now due to COVID-19 has impacted everyone's lives including animals. Farm life plays a huge part in Norfolk and the ELF offers an early insight into farming, and veterinary and social care, as being with animals and working outdoors can improve wellbeing and mental health. Each year I offer a work experience placement in the ELF to give students an insight into working outdoors.'

Unfortunately due to the current challenges and restrictions in school it has not been possible to open the ELF to the students. It is hoped it will in the near future.
