

# Northgate joins efforts to help Ukrainian families

Earlier in the month, Northgate students and staff joined forces to support the Ukraine Appeal. After reading and hearing about the devastation and loss of the Ukrainian people, Mrs Graves and Mr Macdonald wanted to do something to help. They joined forces with Ian Odgers and Leanne Jarman (Morrisons Community Champion) who were the driving force behind the Dereham community's efforts. An appeal was launched for students and staff to bring in Bags for Lives, a Morrisons bag for life filled with essential items to help those in need. The appeal was launched on Friday 4th March and on the following Monday we were totally overwhelmed by the huge number of bags donated and the generosity of everyone. Approximately 200 bags were filled with coats, hats, gloves, other warm clothes, nappies, toiletries and more. It really was a sight to behold, a sea of donations. Year 7s wrote messages of support to be included with the donations. Mr Macdonald, expressed his pride at the response. "All the bags were completely full. We had all sorts being donated and it was a really touching reaction from the school, right from the youngest students up to the older ones and the staff. The whole school is chuffed to bits with what we have achieved."


#### **Great British Spring Clean**


The next attendance raffle will be drawn after Easter.

## Science Week

British Science week opened with the STEM club science fair. The STEM club had been working for eight weeks on projects that were self -selected, they had to come up with a theory or question to investigate and spent time researching or carrying out practical work in order to present their results to their peers, teachers and parents. Two projects were declared joint winners on equal points. Well done to Amelie and Oscar (Year 8) for their project looking at skin growth and repair and the role of blood cells in that process. Well done also to Seren and Kyra (Year 8) for their project investigating how rates of respiration in yeast change when using different substrates.

Later in the week, a bus of Year 7s made their way to the National Space Centre in Leicester. There was a chance to see a real piece of the moon, rockets, experience a planetarium, learn how astronauts train and much more.

The week ended with the whole of Year 7 and 8 being able to see a science display by a fabulous company called Wonderstruck. They truly brought science theory to life with all the different experiments. There were some particularly scary experiments full of peril and loud bangs.
