Year 6 Transition days

Wow - what an amazing two days! We had so many smiley faces of new Year 7s arriving at the gates on our transition days and they managed to pack in so much on their first two days at Northgate.

They met Mrs Graves, Head of Year, their tutors, started to make new friends and attended lessons including Maths, Art, Drama, French, Textiles, Science, English and PE. All Year 7s also received a special book and reading challenges for over the summer, from Head Librarian, Mrs Gill.

On day two, it was time for a fun-filled and educational day delivered by Forensic Minds. Students learnt about fingerprinting, blood spatter analysis, DNA and Edmond Locard's principle of exchange, which states, "Every contact leaves a trace".

Some of this knowledge was then put into practice, when they took and analysed their own fingerprints. One student, Oscar, was excited to discover that one of his prints is known as an 'accidental pattern' - less than 1% of all fingerprints have this pattern. Later, students completed a microscope quiz and a question and answer session with Diane and Andy, who shared their




Year 7s make a positive start to their Northgate journey

August saw many of our new Year 7s start their Northgate journey as they attended our week-long Summer School. Organised by Miss Lynn, it gave students the opportunity to take part in a wide variety of activities as well as get to know each other a little better. Throughout the week they played various 'getting to know you' games as they were split into three groups. Sessions included writing acrostic poems about their favourite places which included creating collages. There was a Harry Potter theme for Maths, converting money in Gringotts bank, scaling potion recipes and creating their own potions as well as solving problems involving the use of the time turner. There were team games and capture the flag in PE, whilst in Science they made and tested paper aeroplanes looking at which designs worked best and adjusting to get the furthest flight. In Computing they were shown how to log onto their school email accounts, looked at what3words and played some quizzes on blooket. There was the chance to be code breakers in a group activity deciphering Morse code, pig pen ciphers, Caesar shifts and substitution codes and in Drama they played team games including making shapes out of people. Groups also had the opportunity of a music lesson and to learn some first aid. All in all it was a great week - excellent attitudes, effort and focus - already displaying elements of Northgate's 5Rs, including RESPECT, READINESS and RESILIENCE. There was a competition between all the Year 7 and 8 classes to read the height of Mrs Galley. Students added to their class total by completing an Accelerated Reader quiz - and it was worked out based on the word count of the books. A huge well done to 7 Integrity who were crowned winners and received doughnuts and sweets as their prizes!

Here are some mind-blowing statistics from our Year 7 and 8 Accelerated Reader scheme from last year: Words read - 30,985,439, Quizzes taken - 1,090, Top quizzers across the whole year -Year 7 - Savannah C, Paige W (completed 51 quizzes), James A, Gabriella G, Gabriela M, Kayley H, Kourtney L, Bartosz W and Setaita K. Top quizzers in Year 8 - Sudanez A, Bella B, Jemima C, Taylor W, Sarah B, Tallulah G, Katie H, Mia S, Maisie S, Seren W. Students with the most words read -**Year 7** - Bartosz W (1,466,983) and **Year 8** - Maisie S (1,339,690).



When a student completes an Accelerated Reader quiz, they get to vote on how they liked the book. The books with the highest votes included: The Heartstopper Series (all volumes had high votes), Messi: From the Playground to the Pitch, Harry Potter and the Chamber of Secrets and Tom Gates Is Absolutely Fantastic (at Some Things). The books which have been guizzed on the most are: Animal Farm and Refugee Boy (both of which are studied in English). Following these, it is Heartstopper (Vol 1 & Vol 2), Harry

Potter and the Philosopher's Stone, Diary of a Wimpy Kid and Run Rebel.

Finally, we are excited that all new Year 7s were given a brand new book to read over the summer, along with some optional reading challenges. Year 7 tutors have been given a copy too,

so we will see what they all make of the book. Every member of staff has also been personally allocated a library book, linked to either their subject or a known personal interest. Support staff's books have been chosen as lucky dip recommendations. Thank you to the library team for organising this!



Record breaking merits

Last year students at Northgate earned the greatest number of merits they have earned during a school year for the last 7 years – a hugely impressive 76,141. A total of 9,865 bonus merits were awarded for excellent attendance, 11,425 were given for no negatives each half term and 4,515 were awarded for great attitude to learning in their screening. So many certificates, badges and trophies were given out across the year, including:

- 1 student who gained 300 or more merits
- 6 students gained 250 merits
- 40 students gained 200 merits
- 139 students gained 150 merits

48 • 340 students gained 100 merits

The weekly merit cashing in was always very busy with 54,079 merits cashed in altogether. Popular items included:

- 155 flexible rulers
- 282 pizza/bacon roll vouchers in Café North
- 102 stress balls
- 119 tennis balls
- 43 sketch books
- 102 footballs, basketballs and rugby balls

This will help fund Science Club activities at Northgate, British Science Week, trips and the CREST award scheme, as well as extra curricular Science events at Dereham Sixth Form College. There have been so many events put on by the Science department this year including a Science Fair during British Science Week and a visit by Wonderstruck for some of our students. Year 7s had the chance to visit the Space Centre in Leicester, whilst Year 8s and 9s visited the Big Bang Fair in Birmingham. A group of Year 9s entered the Global Underwater Challenge and members of our

Science Club took part in the Crest Discovery Award (investigating magic in science, related to Harry Potter) and Crest Bronze Award (for their Science Fair Projects). All of this is alongside their weekly after school club where all sorts of investigations and experiments have taken place.

Camps International trip to Cambodia

During the summer holidays, six of our Year 11 students, alongside Mr Cushion, travelled to Cambodia for a once in a lifetime opportunity with Camps International. It was a chance to experience the culture, explore the country and volunteer in the local community. We received regular updates from Mr Cushion throughout their month long adventure. Here's some of what they got up to:

Team Khlar visited a couple of temples in Phnom Penh as well as a royal building. Students settled into their first camp (Beng Mealea) and visited the local temple within the village, receiving a water blessing from the monks. They began their project work which was building a chicken coup to help the local village with food security and provide an income. This involved clearing foliage and then building fencing, creating the structure for the coup itself and weaving for the roof. Students also planted banana trees for another food source and to create shade for the chickens. They made pots to capture rainwater so that the local community have more water stores to help with access to water throughout the dry season. They also planned lessons to deliver to the local primary and secondary students to help them with their English. Team Khlar got to their second camp in Siem Reap after completing their jungle trek. They trekked over a mix of terrain and visited isolated temples, waterfalls and a bat cave as well as staying amongst the local population in rural villages where they were invited into the temple by the monks in order to take part in meditation. The whole team rose to the challenge of the trek and truly

immersed themselves in Cambodian culture. Before returning home they visited Angkor Wat. It was an early start to catch the sunrise and they spent the day exploring the site. They then moved on to the final camp where everyone was involved in a range of different projects. This included building toilets for the local community, teaching English to a mix of age groups at the local school and taking part in reforestation.

Well done to all involved - what amazing memories!
