

September 30th saw Northgate host its annual Year 6 Open Evening. It was a chance for Year 6s and their parents/carers to visit the school and take a look



Thank you, Ma'am

At Northgate and Dereham Sixth Form College, we were all saddened to hear of the passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, as she was part of everyone's lives in many ways.

The generations of students who have stepped through the gates of school or college, including staff, all have stories they have shared. This may have been during our Christmas holidays, listening to Her Majesty's Christmas address to the country or simply a trip to the North Norfolk coast or a visit to the Sandringham Estate. Staff and students alike have always had a connection with the Queen in Norfolk and many paid their respects in their own ways during the period of mourning.

Some staff, past and present, have served in HM Forces or been recognised by the Queen for work they have done, including our Clerk to the Trustees, Daphne Price, and former cleaner, Dorothy Winner, being awarded MBEs. The school also has a strong affiliation with The Royal British Legion, and the years of Remembrance services held at Northgate will continue in the future. We must never forget the sacrifices of the past, serving Queen and country.



Form Tutors discussed the passing of Her Majesty during PART lesson and shared in the sadness, writing messages on behalf of tutor groups in the online book of condolence. During Enrichment lessons with Year 7s, it was explained more, the unfolding story of the days after Her Majesty's passing, the days of mourning, leading up to the funeral itself. The union flag at the front of school was lowered on the day Queen Elizabeth II passed away. A bouquet of flowers and heather brought down from Scotland, with a tartan ribbon and a message from all staff and students at Northgate and Dereham Sixth Form College was laid. Thank you Ma'am.
