

So far since September Year 7 students have read 24,503,425 words and taken 1024 quizzes, whilst Year 8 have read 10,582,318 words and taken 387 quizzes - amazing! Congratulations to our most active borrowers - Hope C (Year 7), Charlotte B (Year 8) and Zack H (Year 9). 7RH continue to be our most active tutor group checking out 118 books recently, followed by 7MM with 114 books!

# **Recycling Updates**

Well done to our top recyclers of the first Spring half term - 7RH, 8KT, 9HH, 10SE and 11AS.

Over the half term almost 7.5kg of plastic was recycled which includes Pringles tubes, bread bags and bakery plastic, biscuit wrappers, chocolate bar and sweet wrappers. Keep collecting and doing your bit to recycle this plastic - tutor rooms have a designated box. We are continuing to collect dead pens, felt tips, highlighters and markers, with dead pen pots in each classroom.

Through Terracycle we have now recycled over 700Kg of plastic, raising almost £1000 for the School Council's chosen charity, Cancer Research UK.

Thank you also to those who contribute plastic bottles and bottle tops to the Technology

Department. These are being processed through the plastic machine, being ground down then melted into plastic sheets.
Students are using this plastic in their Technology lessons at the moment.



# Merit Update
