Friday 10th November saw Northgate hold its annual Remembrance Service.
Organised once again by Mr MacDonald, the service involved students, staff and visitors to the school including trustees and members of Unity Education Trust. Head Boy Emmanuel read For the Fallen by Robert Laurence Binyon before Mr Brook played the Last Post. The school fell silent to show their respects. Head Boy Owen and Head Girl Poppi then read In Flanders Fields by John McCrae.

Representatives from each year group were invited to lay their crosses and poppies as a mark of remembrance, alongside Deputy Head Boys Blake and Hugo and Deputy Head Girl Abi. Students from uniformed groups such as cadets, Scouts and Guides, gathered for the service, wearing their uniforms with pride. Heads of School, Dr Hone and Mrs Galley laid their crosses and read Kohima Epitaph, attributed to John Maxwell Edmunds. Mr Hambling, CEO of Unity Education Trust, and Mr Alan Jones, Chair of Trustees laid their crosses, followed by members of staff. The service was accompanied on the

piano by Mirren and Lilly (Year 9). Thank you to all those involved in the service. We are always proud of how our students mark this day.







Boys Football round up

As we reach the winter break in the season due to the dark nights all year groups have played a number of games.

Year 7: Unfortunately, the Year 7 team have lost both their games so far against Attleborough and Wymondham High School but all good things come to those



Northgate receives Computer Award

We were delighted to announce earlier this month that Northgate High School has been recognised for delivering high quality computing education to young people, developing their digital skills,

and preparing them for the future.

The school has achieved the national Computing Quality Mark after evaluating its computing education and demonstrating high-quality provision. The Computing Quality Mark is awarded by the National Centre for Computing Education and recognises excellence of computing education offered by a school as part of their curriculum development through the Computing Quality Framework (CQF).

Mrs Woods, Head of Computer Science, said: 'As a team, we have worked on developing a computing curriculum fit for the digital age. With much more still to come, I am honoured to be part of such an amazing and forward-thinking school.'

Northgate completed all seven aspects of the CQF in order to receive the Computing Quality Mark, which recognises achievement in:

Leadership and Vision, Curriculum and Qualifications, Teaching, Learning and Assessment, Staff Development, Equity, Diversity, Inclusion and SEND, Careers Education and Impact on Outcomes.

Northgate is just one of only two schools in Norfolk to have been accredited with this award - a fantastic achievement!

Northgate High School NCCE Computing Quality Mark STEM Improving gender balance in computer science

Computer science is the fastest-growing STEM subject, and yet, despite its popularity, girls are consistently outnumbered by boys. In 2023, only one in five GCSE Computer Science and 15% of all A level Computer Science entries were from female students in England. However, at Northgate High School, we are consistently narrowing the gender gap, which has resulted in being recognised by the National Centre for Computing Education as having made great progress in encouraging girls into computer science.

Merit Update
