

On Friday 8th December, George Freeman MP visited Northgate High School. George is the Member of Parliament for Mid-Norfolk, and until early November was Minister of State in the Department for Science, Innovation and Technology.

We made the most of the hour that George was able to be with us, with Mr Oldfield guiding him round Northgate, introducing him to students, members of staff and explaining the positive impact that becoming a Laboratory School has made.

George demonstrated a deep interest in the learning that was going on; he contributed his French skills in Miss Abdouni's lesson and was fascinated by the political debate in Mr Hester's History lesson. In Mrs Chalmers' Maths class he joined in solving the problems the students were working through, followed by a perfectly timed arrival at Mrs Graves' English lesson where Year 10 were in the middle of studying persuasive speaking. With his experience as an MP, George was able to offer a few pointers and encourage the class too.

After pausing to watch the PE students competing in the Tough Mudder - he wasn't tempted to join in - the visit finished with a question-and-answer time with the Head Students in the Library. They quizzed George on his successes as an MP and the issues he would like to address in the future, and he took a keen interest in their views. He expressed how impressed he was with the atmosphere of the school, how engaged in their learning the students were and how passionate

about their subjects the teachers were. George has invited us to take a group of students to Parliament, to meet him and see it an action - watch this space for news about the visit.




Accelerated Reader Stars




