SPARX Success!

The Maths Department successfully launched SPARX Maths to Year 10s in January and they have already completed their first few homework tasks. This means Years 9, 10 and 11 are now all using the online platform which tailors questions to each student and the department is pleased with the approach students are taking each week. Since September an incredible 210,535 questions have been answered correctly across **3,927** hours of personalised learning. Close to 220 students have also gained enough XP to level up. 

pruning the apple trees and planting. The Committee has also got hands on with making tree cookie Christmas decorations, twisted willow stars, clay insects, researching flowers and more.



Congratulations to all our students who represented Northgate at the Mid-Norfolk Cross-Country competition at Neatherd on 11th January. It was a very successful event for our students, which included three age group race winners!

Well done to Grace M and Cameron N (Year 7) and Liam C (Year 9) who won their races and to the Year 7 girls who won the team event. The Year 7 boys narrowly lost out to Neatherd so

finished second in the team event.

We had many additional qualifiers who finished in the top eight of their age group race and went on to represent Mid Norfolk at the Norfolk Schools finals at Wymondham College on 23rd January.

Cameron finished 4th and Gracie finished 9th both qualifying to represent Norfolk at the Anglian Schools Championships on Saturday 4th February at Abingdon Park in Northampton. These are exceptional performances by both students especially Cameron's 4th place

against some of the top runners from around Norfolk.





Make you vote count

Throughout February our students will have the opportunity to cast their vote in PART lesson in the UK Youth Parliament's 'Make Your Mark' campaign. Make Your Mark gives all young people aged 11-18 in the UK the chance to have a say on the biggest issues facing young people. Previous topics voted on have included stopping plastic pollution, votes at 16, tackling discrimination and hate crime in the UK, tackling child

poverty and supporting our mental health, amongst others.

Students will also have the chance to vote for candidates to represent them in the Norfolk Youth Parliament elections. Finally, there will be the chance to have their say on changes they want to see locally in the Youth Advisory Board Consultation. Akhina, Year 9, said, 'Attending Tia's talk was a transformative experience that left an incredible

mark on my appreciation for storytelling and literature. I felt extremely lucky to give Tia an introduction speech. During the workshop we were able to write about a favourite part from her book, 'Crossing the Line'. We explored the paths of creative writing. I loved every part of the task and workshop, it was a pleasure being there.'

about what inspired her to write her book:


'Crossing the line'. I also really enjoyed the

Recycling

Congratulations to our recent top recycling tutor groups 7AS, 8RH, 9KT, 10AB and 11SE. During the last half term, students and staff recycled 7.9Kg of soft plastics which included bread bags, bakery plastic, crisp packets, biscuit, and cake bar wrappers. The Terracycle Schemes also includes Pringles tubes. This is on top of several kilograms of pens, board markers and highlighters. The plastic gets sent away to Terracycle, ground into plastic pellets and then made into new plastic items. In return, the school receives money per kilogram of plastic sent away. The more we recycle, the more we earn!

Since the school joined its first scheme back in 2018, over 320Kg of writing instruments, 380Kg of crisp packets and 100Kg of other plastics have been recycled, with the help of community groups too. This has raised a fantastic £590 for Cancer Research UK (chosen by School Council members) and £250 for the school! Please continue to send in your plastics – all tutor groups have their own collection boxes and all classrooms have dead pen pots.
